#### **Happy Easter!**

This month we celebrate the most important, and I might add, joyous holiday of the Christian year! Easter—the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

In Christ Jesus we celebrate the fact that death will not have a permanent hold on us. That the little deaths we sometimes experience in our on-going lives will not prevail against us either, for we have been baptized into Jesus' life, death and resurrection.

Yes indeed, we can trust in the promise of new life after death, which Jesus promises to all who have faith in him. But less we forget, we can also trust in that same promise of resurrection when enduring the trials and tribulations we encounter in our everyday lives. In ancient and medieval times, life was often so difficult that people felt they could only look forward to life after death. And certainly, they weren't wrong to have such hope. 

#### THURSDAY WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY - MIRACLES OF JESUS

The Thursday Evening Women's Bible Study group resumes on Thursday, April 24<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. The six-to-eight-week study will focus on the Miracles of Jesus as explored by Jewish New Testament Scholar, Amy-Jill Levine. (The group meets at 47 Deerhaven Lane, Rensselaer 12144.)

For each miracle, Amy-Jill Levine discusses not only how past witnesses would have understood the events, but also how today's readers can draw meaning from Jesus's words and actions. Chapter topics include:

Giving sight to the blind: Metaphors of understanding (Mark 8, John 9); "Take up your pallet and walk" (the paralyzed man): On the role of caregivers; A bleeding woman and a dead girl: The importance of women's bodies; Walking on water and stilling the storm: Ecological readings of the Gospels; The feeding of the 5,000 (or more): The centrality of bread; The raising of Lazarus: Taking death seriously.

Throughout this study Levine calls us to the interpretive work, reminding us that the big question is not "did this happen?" but "what does it mean?" and ultimately "so what?" How can these old miracle stories speak good news to our lives in this time and place and invite our own healing and transformation along the way?



# HOPE BOOK GROUP REMEMBERS - THE DAY THE WORLD CAME TOWN - 09/11/2001 (4/30/25 - NEW DAY)

Hope Book Group will return on April 30, 2025 at 6:30 pm at the home of Marilyn Dyer and Elaine Berg. The new meeting day will be the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of each month. April's choice is The Day the World Came to Town 9/11 in Gender, Newfoundland by Jim DeFede.

When 38 jetliners bound for the United states were forced to land at Gander International Airport in Canada by the closing of U.S. airspace on September 11th, the population of this small

town on Newfoundland island swelled from 10,300 to nearly 17,000.

The citizens of Gander met the stranded passengers with an overwhelming display of friendship and goodwill. As the passengers stepped from the airplanes, exhausted, hungry and distraught after being held on board for nearly 24 hours while security checked all of the baggage, they were greeted with a feast prepared by the townspeople. Many of the passengers developed friendships with Gander residents that they expect to last a lifetime.

This book recounts the inspiring stories of the residents of Gander, Canada, whose acts of kindness have touched the lives of thousands of people and have been an example of humanity and good will. As anniversaries of the event approached, author DeFede updated many of the stories told in the original edition.
