
# From the Pastor Desk

Some information/updates to share with the congregation as a result of our recent Council meeting:

#### **Property Committee Updates:**

- Mike Daus and his brother plan to extend the closet in the small classroom for additional storage. Mike will provide the materials.
- Marilyn Dyer -and volunteer helpers- have created a list of projects to improve some areas of the church, such as:
  - Will be converting the choir-robe closet into an additional space for the janitor supplies.
  - Will put an expandable gate (borrowed) around the children's play area in the back of the sanctuary.
  - Will buy some bins for the outside entrance area to improve the looks and will hold donations bags etc.
  - Will also get someone to work on the other entrance door, to get it to open properly.
  - ➤ Will check into remodeling the coat rack area looking for a carpenter/estimate.
  - Will relocate hymnals, bibles, etc. from bookshelves in sanctuary and reuse the bookshelves in another location.

#### **Greg Whitney reported on several subjects:**

- Recent problems with the shed being tampered with and someone ransacking bags inside. The
  police have been notified and he has contacted St. Pauley's Textile. He had a security light/motion
  sensor installed and will have a security camera installed at the shed and in the parking lot.

- Greg has received quotes for sealcoating/restriping the parking area, which will be done in August.
- For the future of HLC, Greg suggested we keep a check list of all types of maintenance updates that need to be done every month/year, etc., such as driveway sealing, furnace maintenance, carpets shampooed, and any other types of upkeep throughout the church.

Chairs after service will be moved to the sides of the room to make way for any events during the week. We'll be creating an emergency contact list for the members of the congregation, to keep on file if needed. Pastor Pamela will talk to Tonya about assisting with this, as well as Sandra G.& Donna L. Our PB & Jelly campaign - for Conserns-U and Doors of Hope have been very successful!! Thank you, Jim Macris, for organizing!

#### **Emotional Intelligence (EI)**

It is generally accepted that success in life is better predicted by EI than IQ.

It is generally accepted that emotionally-aware congregations are usually better able to process the stresses that confront them than those congregations that are not. It could be useful for us, individually, to think our own thoughts about each of these emotions, and if any is so inclined, to share one's thoughts with another. In the last newsletter, I offered the emotion 'overwhelmed' under the core emotion of 'Fear' and asked you to ponder your own thoughts.

overwhelmed (overcome, as with emotions or perceptual stimuli) – When overwhelmed, sometimes, we lack competence. At other times, we are blind-sided, sucker-punched.

Though life's curveball may arrive as a single chunk, we do not have to swallow it in one gulp. We can pick a small piece and ask the question: "What can I do now?". If the answer is nothing, then set it aside and pick up another piece and ask again. If the answer is 'yes', then do it. If needed, take a break. Sometimes, working on something else helps. Continue working with one piece at a time. Over time, a previous no may become a yes and in time all the pieces that need to be addressed are addressed and those remaining can simply be let go and entrusted to the One who is ultimately in control of the outcomes of all of life's conundrums.

Over time, we grow in strength, competence, and understanding. We increase our capacity to draw from the strengths of others. We become bigger and the problem smaller. Life loses some of its power to overwhelm us.

Next month, please consider your thoughts on 'skeptical' under the core emotion of 'Anger'.
