The above picture was taken at the garden I visited while on vacation. Perhaps this flower is familiar to you, but I've never seen a black sunflower before. Stunning was the word that popped into my brain—an "Un expected Reality," I thought. One of the things that has occurred to me lately is that life is chock full of "Unexpected Realities." Human beings like to think of themselves as living normal lives until a crisis occurs. Yet between the normal activities of life and life crises is another reality. A reality that usually surprises us or is unexpected. Such as when I happened upon this beautiful black sunflower. During such instances we are reminded of God's love of diversity and the spirit of God's presence throughout all of creation. Yet I would be remiss if I didn't mention the fact that "Unexpected Realities" can be both positive and negative. Too often, for instance, I see a mother with a young child walking down the street. Her total focus is on her cell phone; it being clear to any observer that this child is being ignored. I sometimes see this with fathers as well. I am always disturbed by this "Unexpected Reality." But just as I see God's fingerprints when looking at that black sunflower, I find myself stopping and praying in that moment that God's love be with that child and awaken the parent to the gift of their child, whose hand they now hold. Yet I know in this moment that God holds this child's hand as well. God helps us to see all the realities in our midst, but good and bad. God is not just with us in our normal days, or just with us in our crisis moments, but God's Spirit rejoices with us in the "Unexpected Realities" which pepper our days.

May your days be filled with "Unexpected Realities" of joy.

Greetings Hope Family,

Over the last 2 months we have been discussing the need to replace our 62-year-old boiler.

With over \$5,000 in repairs for our boiler last year, it is the leadership's plan to replace the boiler in October 2024.

We have created a building fund to try to raise \$15,000 for this expected expense.

We have started off with a campaign to raise funds in three different ways:

- Bring your extra change to church
- 2. Bring your returnable bottles/cans to church (we get 6 cents each)
- 3. Donate through a QR code or by writing a check

There has been some interest in wanting to contribute but not being able to do so at this point. To accommodate this request, we have created a pledge sheet specificity for the boiler replacement fund.

If you have already donated to this fund, thank you. If not, please consider what role you can play in this expense for the church.

To date, we have raised almost \$7,000. We still need another \$8,000 to meet our goal.

If by October we have not met our goal, funds will be taken out of our investments. If funds are received after the installation of the boiler, money taken from investments will be replaced.







BOOK GROUP READS ABOUT ELEPHANTS - August 13, 2024


