Spring is here! Recently I've noticed that quite a few of the pollinator flowers we planted last fall are starting to bloom. If you sit in the Solarium, you can see just how lovely they are as they begin to blossom. We broke ground for our pollinator garden in the Fall of 2022. I am so grateful to the many members who have been involved in this project from the very beginning, and for those members along the way who have donated their time and energy, their seedlings and plants to our pollinator garden here at Hope. The beginnings of this pilot project came about as a result of our participation in the ELCA Congregations Lead Initiative program. A program focused on innovation within the congregations of the ELCA. To that end the national church has even established an Innovation Lab, whereby this Innovation Lab serves as a resource for congregations, also sharing ideas and projects between congregations that have worked. We are now in the second year of this two-year program. As part of the program, we are assigned a coach. In speaking with him recently and telling him about all the ministries that are taking place here at Hope, including our pollinator garden, he seemed genuinely excited for us. He made the observation that our pollinator garden seemed to be a metaphor for what is happening here at Hope with all the various ministries being done by this small, but mighty congregation. Think of what we do here as seeds of the gospel of Jesus Christ being planted, through our ministries, into the community. Yes, spring is here. And with that, opportunities for new and resurrected life.

The Upstate NY Synod Hunger Justice Team invites you and your congregation to participate in the 2023 synodwide appeal.


Each congregation is challenged to raise \$440 or more to cover the cost of two bee colonies (\$20 each) and two community gardens(\$200 each).

Emotional Intelligence (EI)

It is generally accepted that success in life is better predicted by EI than IQ. It is generally accepted that emotionally-aware congregations are usually better able to process the stresses that confront them than those congregations that are not. It could be useful for us, individually, to think our own thoughts about each of these emotions, and if any is so inclined, to share one's thoughts with another. In the last newsletter, I offered the emotion 'confident' under the core emotion of 'Happy' and asked you to ponder your own thoughts.

These are my thoughts:

<u>confident</u> – If my self-confidence was low, I would not have been able to persevere for 30-40 years in such unfavorable environments. My strong but malleable ego is not an easy combination for some people to process. In an anxious family system, people remember, far too long, their negative reactions to my strong ego, and seldom notice how I adapt for the sake of others. Others do not play by the same rules. I am at a disadvantage. The darts fired at those standing firm, during anxious times, hurt. Public deformations of character endure, though, holding fast (graciously and compassionately) during the passing of time holds the promise of living bigger than what is hurled at you. To refrain from launching a counterattack, a tremendous amount of humbled, self-confidence is required – self-confidence fortified with self-differentiation.

Next month, please consider your thoughts on 'isolated' under the core emotion of 'Sad'.


