News from our church committees and Council Business:

- Our Website is continuing to be updated and improved – Greg Whitney.
- The CLI team (Congregational Lead Initiative) will be meeting in November to continue with plans for creating the Community Garden in the Spring - Pastor Pamela and team.


HOPE'S BOOK CLUB

Poinsettia Plant – Poisonous to Pets?

Not according to the article "Holiday Health Hazards" from the College of Veterinary Medicine at Washington State University. In the article <http://www.vetmed.wsu.edu/ClientED/holiday.aspx>, it is stated that poinsettias "...are not very toxic to pets. They do contain a milky sap that can irritate the mouth but if signs develop they are usually mild." Further research online supporting this can be found at numerous sites including the ASPCA's site (<http://www.aspc.org/pet-care/poison-control/plants/poinsettia.html>) which states that for pets, poinsettias are "irritating to the mouth and stomach, sometimes causing vomiting, but are generally over-rated in toxicity" and that "While poinsettias are commonly "hyped" as poisonous plants, they rarely are, and the poisoning is greatly exaggerated" (<http://www.petpoisonhelpline.com/poison/poinsettia>).
